SERVING THOSE WHO SERVE

IN 2024, PCCI SUPPORTED 350+ VETERANS

According to the 2024 Atlanta Point in Time Count, 10% of people experiencing homelessness in Atlanta are veterans of the United States Armed Forces. PCCI is honored to help these individuals secure housing and access services.

PCCI has a dedicated team of professionals who understand the unique needs of service members and how to navigate the programs and systems available to help veterans achieve their goals.

Operation Reveille Atlanta

Operation Reveille Atlanta is an annual event that brings together a diverse network of community partners, service providers, and government agencies to support veterans experiencing homelessness. The event serves as a crucial opportunity to connect veterans with essential resources such as housing assistance, benefits enrollment, legal aid, and employment services.

For PCCI, Operation Reveille is not only a means to provide direct assistance to veterans but also a valuable opportunity for staff engagement, collaboration, and capacity building with other service organizations in the region.



PCCI's Participation & Impact

At this year's event, five PCCI staff members were in attendance, working closely with veterans in need of housing support. Their efforts led to the following outcomes:

- Engaged with over 30 veterans seeking housing assistance.
- Provided on-the-spot eligibility screenings for immediate service access.
- Scheduled appointments for SSVF (Supportive Services for Veteran Families) assessments with PCCI Housing Coordinators.
- Issued referrals to appropriate agencies to ensure veterans received the best-suited support for their needs.

REFLECTIONS & TAKEAWAYS

For the fifth consecutive year, PCCI has played an active role in Operation Reveille. As with previous events, this year's experience was deeply impactful and fulfilling. Engaging directly with veterans and hearing their stories reinforced the importance of PCCI's mission and the critical role we play in the fight to end veteran homelessness.

Operation Reveille Atlanta continues to be an invaluable event for both veterans and service organizations like PCCI. Through direct engagement, collaboration, and strategic problem-solving, PCCI remains committed to providing housing solutions and resources to those who have served our country. We look forward to further strengthening our impact in the years ahead.

STABLE HOMES, STRONGER FAMILIES

\$107,574 IN RENTAL ASSISTANCE TO 35 FAMILIES

PCCI remains committed to partnering with the Georgia Department of Family and Children Services to reduce the number of families involved in the child welfare system. The pilot program in Fulton County yielded positive outcomes, leading to its expansion into DeKalb County.

To assess the impact of the child welfare and rapid rehousing program, PCCI collaborated with Child Trends for an evaluation. As we approach our goal of serving 50 families, our efforts extend beyond securing housing and providing short-term rental assistance. Many families continue to require support in employment, credit building, childcare, and transportation to achieve long-term stability.

PCCI remains dedicated to fostering partnerships and connecting families with the essential resources they need to sustain their housing and build a secure future.
